
*Where There's a Will, There's a Way: The Tracy Martinez Story*

on her degree as a Physicians Assistant while her husband, Demencio, supports the family. Tracy recently made the Deans List. Way to go Tracy! She plans to transfer to the University of Texas at San Antonio in the fall of 2011. Tracy says "anyone can do it" and that she will help anyone

who wants to attend college to apply for financial aid and fill out the application. That is what you call "paying it forward!"

## Springtown Villa Welcomes the Fall


