## *Major Improvements to our Resident Services Centers!*

We are in the middle of a major upgrade and expansion of services to residents of public housing. Last semester, we began keeping the centers at Allen Woods, C. M. Allen, and Chapultepec open until 9:00 p.m. on school nights. A qualified tutor is available to help you or your children (middle school and up) with school work. You may just need a quiet place to study or access to a computer. This semester, we are upgrading the computers to improve their speed and reliability. At each site, residents will be able to use a combination printer/scanner/fax machine. We also have a telephone in each lab. We are working with Grande Communications to provide cable television, telephone, and Internet service to the centers to help residents reach their goals of self-sufficiency. It's like having a Kinko's right on your block . . . but even better because it is free and we help you with your homework! Schedules are posted on the front doors of each center every week.
