Celebrating the Life of Earl L. Moseley

The Chairman of the San Marcos Housing Authority Board of Commissioners, Earl Moseley, passed away on February 25, surrounded by friends and family.

A lot has been said about Earl — first black city council member in San Marcos, Coordinator of Campus Activities at Texas State University, Elder of the Abundant Life Church in San Marcos, and so on.

What the news left out, however, was that for ten years Earl was a leader on the United Way Board for ten years and on our Board for five years.

I had the good fortune to attend many of those meetings. Earl brought a unique and professional perspective to those meetings . . . along with a sense of humor. He was always supportive of our efforts to do more than just put a roof over peoples' heads but to help them learn how to escape poverty.

I didn't understand how much Earl had affected the lives of others until I spent some time at his Texas State University office , getting his signature for a grant application. The love and respect of staff and students alike was obvious.

Only 48 years old, Earl left us too soon but he beat the odds. He was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer about 10 years ago. He wisely refused to believe the doctors, who assured him he would not last long, choosing instead to believe in the power of prayer and of God's love.

Earl's funeral will be at 11 a.m. on Friday, March 5 at the First Baptist Church of San Marcos. The Housing Authority will close at 10 a.m. that day and will re-open no later than 2 p.m.

What is your good luck charm?

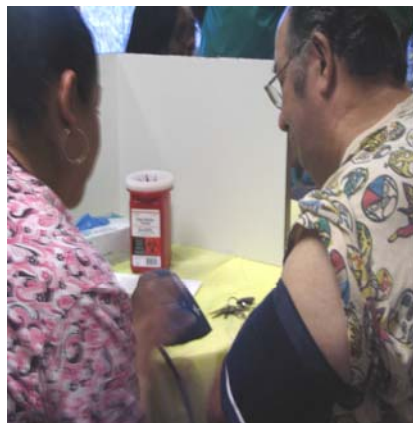
Helping others. I believe when I help others, the good deed comes back to me
