Emergency Maintenance Guidelines from the Maintenance Department


Call the main office (353-5058) with routine and emergency maintenance requests during normal business hours (Monday – Friday, 8 – 5). If you have a routine maintenance problem during non-business hours, report it the next time the office is open. *If you have an emergency maintenance problem during non-business hours, call the Emergency Maintenance Number (738-1243).* If you leave a message, *remain by the phone* until the maintenance worker returns your call. If you do not get a call-back within 5 minutes, call again. Call for any problem inside or outside of your apartment that could result in personal injury or damage to property if not corrected quickly. Please use good judgement. Abuse of the emergency maintenance number may result in charges to you. We *want* to take care of true emergencies quickly. We *do not want* to take workers away from their families and pay overtime for work that can wait.
