Against All Odds: A Single Mother's Continual Journey to Success

As a single mother with five children, limited income, and limited English proficiency, Elizabeth Cante had many odds against her going back to school. Originally from Reynosa Tamaulipas, Mexico, she moved to Houston at the age of II and made her way to San Marcos in 2000. Elizabeth has 5 children ranging from ages 4 to I2 and has had to work two jobs to support her family. When she could not get a good paying job at a warehouse because she did not have a high school diploma, Elizabeth decided to go back to school. After getting her GED, she gained the

confidence to keep moving forward on her education. Elizabeth said, "You put your own limits and everything is possible, you just have to be persistent and hard working." Although one of the challenges she faced was less time available for her kids, her children have been supportive and great motivators. They write her encouraging letters, do house chores, and help take care of each other. Elizabeth completed the GED preparation classes and also graduated the College Prep Academy from Community Action of Central Texas. (See page 7 for more information.) Elizabeth is now on a path to getting her nursing degree. Elizabeth took advantage of the great resources offered at the PODER Learning Center, such as the free after-school and summer programs for her children and the free computer lab for her homework and assignments. She also got connected to a personal mentor and was able to get assistance with her bills when she was struggling. The advice Elizabeth would give others who are looking to go back to school is to keep moving forward and to take advantage of the resources available at the Housing Authority because, as she says, "We have all the resources that we need for success." Elizabeth was recently accepted into the Housing Authority's Family Self-Sufficiency Program. She is looking forward to completing the program and eventually moving into her own house. We are so proud of Elizabeth and wish her great success in the FSS Program!





Sales Tax Holiday—Aug. 8 - 10

From the State Comptroller: As in previous years, the law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales and use taxes, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. Subject to the criteria explained below, all sales of qualifying items made during the holiday period qualify for the exemption, including items sold online, or by telephone or mail. Lay-away plans can be used again this year to take

advantage of the sales tax holiday. The dates for the sales tax holiday are set by the Legislature. Go to the State Comptroller's website to get more information:
