REACHING INTO THE WEEKEND The folks at SMHA Resident Services are always on the lookout for ways to secure new services that can help residents move toward ever-increasing self-sufficiency.



Recently, in cooperation with the Capital Area Food Bank (CAFB) and Feeding America, a nationwide network for regional food banks, Resident Services added a new dimension to our after-school programs. When kids get off the school buses, they run in to the Resident Services center at their site and get a hot meal as part of Kid's Cafe, which is sponsored by CAPITAL AREA CAFB. This goes on four days a week, Monday through Thursday. According to FOOD BANK FeedingAmerica.org: "More than 21 million children qualify for free or reduced-price meals OF TEXAS through the National School Lunch Program and the National School Breakfast Program.



For many of these children, school meals may be the only meals they eat. What happens when they go home over the weekend? For more than 15 years, the Feeding America BackPack Program has been helping children get the nutritious and easy-to-prepare food they need to get enough to eat on the weekends. Today, bags of food are assembled at more than 160 local food banks and then distributed to more than 450,000 children at the end of the week."



In the first month of the new service, our staff distributed 269 backpacks, each of which contains enough food for four meals. Gene Martin II, our Resident Services Program Director, said that the Capital Area Food Bank ran a pilot program at a few agencies in the summer. The BackPack program became available in our area only this Fall. He said, "We're very happy to have this opportunity to bring a new service to our residents." Does it make a difference? Maria Calcaben, Service Coordinator at the PODER Learning Center, reported that a mother at her site was very grateful because it was the only food she had for her kids that weekend.

Housing Authority offices will be closed on December 24, 25, & 26. Offices will close at 3 PM on December 31 and will be closed on January 1.



His daughter and other kids in the neighborhood used to participate in the KAD after-school program, often running through that lot. Bill would sometimes mow it himself because the owner was not getting it done. Today, Bill's daughter, Megan Spiller, is our Senior FSS Coordinator! The new & improved park has transformed the area. Bonnie Pecina, our Service Coordinator at C. M. Allen, has been with us since 1990 and has seen the changes that have occurred around the edges of the Conway neighborhood, which is bounded by River Road, I-35, and Bugg Lane. She says, "I see a lot of mothers with their children, sitting there, watching them play. Before that, they had no where to take their children."
