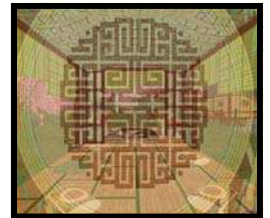

A Time for Growth and Development!

It's a new year and some of you have violated your lease agreement by not complying with the Public Housing Community Service requirements! When

you signed your lease you agreed to perform 8 hours of community service each month or to participate in 8 hours of training, counseling, or classes. Such activi-

ties help you to support yourselves. Some people are exempt from this requirement. If you are over 62 years old, if you are disabled, if you are working at least 20 hours

a week, if you are participating in a welfare-to-work program (such as the FSS Program or the TANF Choices Program), or if you are a full time student, you are exempt from community service.

Otherwise, you must honor the terms of your lease agreement. Failure to meet this obligation can lead to eviction! That is a

problem. Fortunately, we have the solution to that problem. Call Herod at 396-3367 to sign up for the Resident Self-Sufficiency program or to volunteer your time supporting one of our other programs. We can also refer you to other agencies that rely upon volunteer support! We want to help you so call Herod and he will get you started!

Meals on Wheels!

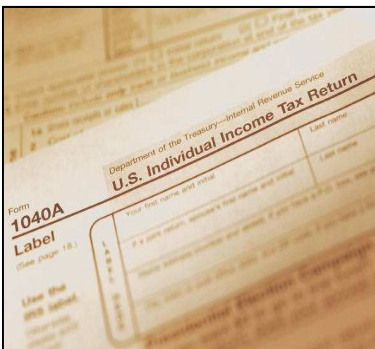
Meals On Wheels Senior Nutrition program 11:30 a.m. at the Allen Woods Senior Center Monday through Friday

Free Income Tax Assistance!



Volunteers from the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) are offering free income tax assistance at the San Marcos Public Library for elderly and low income

persons. Tax Aid begins February 3rd and continues until April 12th. Service is guaranteed to the first 50 people and free e-filing is available. You must bring last year's tax

return, your social security card, a photo ID and any other tax related information with you if you want assistance with your taxes.

Get Registered for the Free GED Preparation Classes at the Adult Learning Center in the San Marcos Public Library!

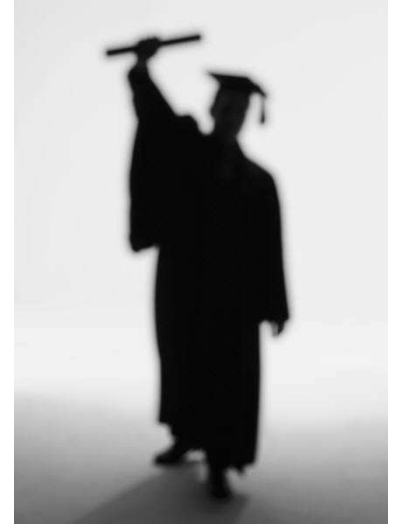
Interested in getting your GED? Then contact the San Marcos Public Library for registration dates and times. Two sessions are required to complete orientation, registration and assessment.

City Appoints New Board Members

The City of San Marcos welcomed dozens of new board and commission members and honored outgoing members at a special reception Thursday, January 17 at 5:30 p.m. at the San Marcos Activity Center. More than 250 new and outgoing board members were appointed by the City Council to serve on 27 boards.
