Stage 2 Water Restrictions In Effect

Stage 2 drought restrictions are in effect due to low aquifer levels. Here are the rules you need to know!



- You can water your grass with a sprinkler one day per week, according to your address, from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. to midnight. Hand watering is allowed any time.
- You can wash your car on your designated weekday, from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. to midnight, using a hand held bucket or a hose with a sprayer that shuts off when you let go of it.
- You may not waste water, fill a new swimming pool, or operate an outdoor decorative water feature.

Designated weekdays: Monday, if your address (or apt. #) ends in a 0 or a 1; Tuesday - 2 or 3; Wednesday - 4 or 5; Thursday - 6 or 7; & Friday - 8 or 9. The City can fine you \$100 to \$1,000!
