They're Back! Bobcat Build 2009



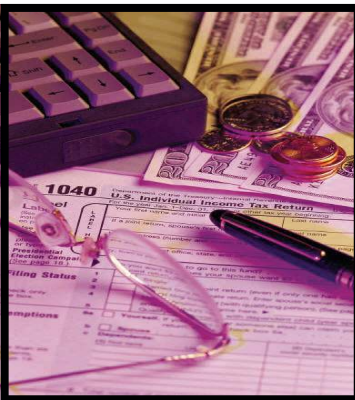

Free Help Preparing Your Income Tax Return



DO NOT PAY SOMEONE TO DO YOUR TAX RETURN! "Rapid Refund" is a loan with fees and interest! Volunteers from AARP, the American Association of Retired Persons, is offering free income tax assistance at the San Marcos Public Library for handicapped, elderly, and low income families. The service is guaranteed to the first 50 people per day and includes E-filing. If you want help, bring a photo ID, your property tax receipt (for home owners), last years tax return, W-2 forms, 1099 forms, unemployment compensation statements, social security cards for everyone in your household, child care provider information (name, employer ID, social security number), and the amount of last years stimulus rebate.
