

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments on the proposed amendment to the PHA 5-year annual plan. The amendment would authorize the use of future Capital Fund Program monies to be used on the flood recovery of C.M Allen Homes. ## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE OCTOBER MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

- The Low Income Housing fund ended the fiscal year (Sept. 30) with a \$222,000 deficit, primarily due to the impact of the Memorial Weekend Flood. Springtown Villa ended the year with a \$112,000 surplus, which will be applied to future improvements and repairs at that facility. (Those funds cannot be applied to CM Allen repairs.)
- Occupancy rates for October: Public Housing 96%, Housing Choice Voucher 100%, Springtown Villa - 100%
- The Board approved a revision of the budget for the Capital Fund Program to allow \$139,000 to be applied to repairs at CM Allen. Albert Sierra reported that the revised cost projection for the CM Allen Recovery Project is \$1.157 million. So far, the Housing Authority has expended \$197,000. FEMA has "qualified" \$50,000 of the \$80,000 spent on the initial cleanup. They will reimburse the 75% of that amount or \$37,500.
- Of the 51 buildings affected by the flood (100 duplex homes and the KAD Korner Store), 30 "Project Worksheets" have been approved by FEMA. 20 units have been repaired, 18 are occupied, move-ins are pending on 2 units, and repairs to 5 units are in progress.
- Sierra said 25 of the evacuated families are living with friends and family. The remainder of the families transferred to other public housing units, received a Section 8 voucher, are in a lease elsewhere, or are not returning.
- The Board approved the request of a donation of \$100,000 from the San Marcos Reinvestment Corporation (SMRC), to help meet FEMA's match requirement on non-federal funds. (The board of the SMRC later approved the request.)
- The Board approved the request of a \$400,000 loan from the SMRC, to be repaid from future Capital Fund allocations. This will require a change in the Housing Authority's 5-Year Plan, which requires a public hearing. (The SMRC later approved the request in principal, pending the result of the public hearing.)




