Paul came to San Marcos by way of Beeville, moved into public housing in 2003, and took a job as a stocker at Brookshire Brothers in Wimberley. He wasn't making enough money to meet his expenses and needed a better job. Paul enrolled in the Resident Self-Sufficiency (RSS) Program and began learning how to use a computer. He took classes on handling money and

started to brush-up on his reading and writing skills.

The RSS Coordinator assisted Paul in refining his resume. A neighbor took Paul to Gary Job Corps and introduced him to some of his friends in the human resources department. Paul then applied for a job at Gary and two weeks later he was hired. Paul started working in the maintenance department and was recently promoted to a maintenance supervisor position. He currently supervises two co-workers. During his employment at Gary, Paul has earned three raises and two bo-

nuses. Now, he rents a two-bedroom apartment, pays his bills on time, makes regular payments on a new pickup, and adds to his savings account every month.

NEW! Community Action College Readiness Program

Community Action is a partner in our self-sufficiency efforts. The purpose of their *College Readiness Program* is to prepare students who have dropped out of a Texas public school for college. This includes getting your GED, getting a passing score on a college placement test, and successfully completing at least one college course from the college’s core curriculum. To help, Community Action will do the following:

- Provide instruction and tutoring to prepare you for college-level classes in math, reading and writing so you don’t have to waste valuable time and money in remedial courses.
- Counsel you on an individual graduation plan which will include the areas you need to work on most and a timeline for completing certain goals.
- Counsel you on researching and selecting careers and schools so you can pick the program that’s best for you.
- Help you with getting financial aid, including grants, loans, and scholarships.
- Work with you on developing higher-level critical thinking skills needed to succeed in college.
- Work with you on developing success skills, such as time-management, study skills, and the ability to navigate complex college systems.
- Provide you with a student mentor who has been where you are and can help you succeed.
- Provide you with limited assistance for things such as childcare and transportation so you have a better chance for success.
- Provide a combination of on-site and online learning to best fit your schedule and learning style.

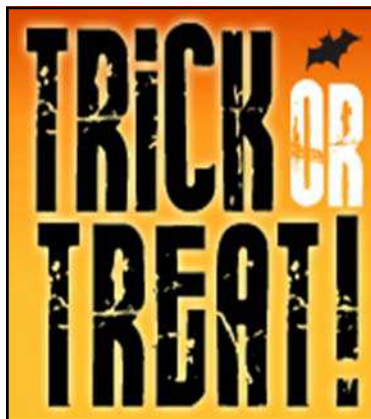
Eligible participants must:

- Be 16-25 years old.
- Have dropped out of a Texas public school.
- Spend at least 6-12 hours per week in class or using the online software.
- Commit to an individualized learner’s contract, and stick with it.
- Be motivated, be prepared to work hard, and be prepared to learn.
- Be committed to completing a two-year college degree program.
