#### When Should You Remove Your Christmas Decorations?

Take your tree and other decorations down on January 5. Why? Because in 567, the Council of Tours proclaimed the twelve days from Christmas to Epiphany as a sacred and festive season, and established the duty of Advent fasting in preparation for the feast. Christmastide, commonly called the Twelve Days of Christmas, lasts 12 days, from December 25 to January 5, the latter date being named as Twelfth Night of Christmas. These traditional dates are still followed by many Protestant churches. Some say that leaving your tree up beyond the official Christmas season brings bad luck, especially if you do not remove all Christmas decorations, lights, and spray foam by January 15.


We had two crafting days this month. We made snowflake ornaments the first day and angels on the second day. Residents enjoy these activities because it gives them the opportunity to learn something new!


