

New Commissioners Appointed to Housing Authority Board

At the March meeting of the Board of Commissioners, outgoing Chairperson Gloria Salazar administered the oath of office to new commissioners as well as those who were appointed to a second two-year term. The new commissioners are Juan Miguel Arredondo and Richard Cruz. Returning commissioners are Rose Brooks, Maggie Moreno, and Gerald Brown (Resident Commissioner).

The new Board elected officers. Ms. Moreno is the new Chairperson and Mr. Arredondo is the new Vice-Chairperson. Executive Director Albert Sierra serves as Secretary. The Board is responsible for general oversight of the Housing Authority. They meet about 10 times per year on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 5:30 PM at the main office of the SMHA, which is at the Allen Woods Homes.

MAINTENANCE EMERGENCIES: WHAT ARE THEY AND WHAT SHOULD YOU DO ABOUT IT?

If you have a **maintenance EMERGENCY** during normal office hours, call your management office. If it is after hours, call <u>512-738-1243</u>. Leave a message and the on-call maintenance worker will call you back. Call this number only for emergencies, such as:

- ♦ Gas leaks
- Major water leaks (If your toilet is overflowing, turn off the valve below the tank. If a faucet is broken, turn off the valves below the faucet, if possible.)
- Clogged toilet (if it is the only toilet in your home)
- Lock-outs
- ♦ No electricity to your entire home (Check your breaker box first. If the power is out in your neighborhood, call the San Marcos Electric Utility at 512-393-8313.)
- ◆ No air conditioning or heating (only when it is very hot or very cold)

For all NON-EMERGENCY maintenance requests, call your site office during regular office hours or submit a request using the form on our website:

Don't forget to click on the "submit" button. Regardless of how we receive the request, you can expect a response within 2 business days, Monday through Friday.

If you will not be at home during normal business hours:

- Make sure your front screen door is unlocked.
- Disengage your ring-bolt or keyless dead-bolt.
- ◆ If you have a dog, it must not be loose in the area where the work will be done.
