They give Donna a hug and feel more comfortable talking about their problems. Next came along Donna's cousin Lawrence, a grey plush alpaca who loves adventures. At the end of the week, one lucky child is chosen to take Lawrence home and write about his or her adventures in Lawrence's journal. It is a great way to encourage responsibility and journaling among the kids. The newest addition to the family is a knitted llama, crafted by resident Arleen Machado, named Horatio the Happy Llama. His job is to bring joy and happiness to the kids. Of course, as great as our toy llamas and alpacas are, it



is even better to see one in real life! Our teens were treated to a trip to Tierra Prometida (Promised Land), an alpaca ranch located in the majestic hills of Wimberley. A little rain didn't spoil the late afternoon tour of the ranch. The teens and volunteers were greeted by curious alpacas and although some were shy, other alpacas were happy to get petted and pictured with the Housing Authority group. Tour guide Jenny showed the group the different areas where they keep the alpacas and shared information about the animal. Ever wonder what the difference between alpacas and llamas are? Alpacas are much smaller, more docile, and have rounder ears. Alpacas, llamas, and camels all come from the same family. The teens learned this and other interesting alpaca facts during the tour. The best part about the field trip was being able to interact



with the animals! Although most of the alpacas had recently gotten their fleece sheered, they still felt soft when petted. The alpacas that still had their thick fleece felt like a cloud! My hand would slightly sink in and be surrounded by the warmth of the fleece. Those alpacas stayed in a separate area of the ranch where they could stay cool with fans until they were ready to be sheered. Once sheered, their fleece is collected in another barn and ready to be shipped and processed for clothing, blankets, and other goods. At the end of the trip, Keandre Richardson exclaimed that the field trip felt unbelievable because it was such a cool experience. We are so grateful for the opportunity to interact with and learn a little bit more about these exotic animals.
