- Aguacate maduro 2
- Pan de molde rebanadas 4
- Cebolla morada 50g
- Aceite de oliva virgen extra 15 ml
- Mayonesa 15g
- Finas Hierbas 3g
- Sal
- Pimienta negra molida

SMHA BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Board of Commissioners covered a lot of territory at their June meeting. First up was a presentation about the 2017 audit. The auditors reported to the Commissioners that the Housing Authority had good financial controls and there were no findings (which is accountant-speak for problems). The only issue was that Housing Authority reserves are significantly decreased as a result of the longterm consequences of the 2015 floods. Executive Director Albert Sierra reported to the Commissioners about the progress of the Housing Authority's application to recover funds expended in the repair of the CM Allen homes from the CDBG – DR program. The Housing Authority has applied to the city for \$864,803. As part of the process, the Housing Authority was required to get elevation assessments from FEMA and to add additional flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program. The assessments have been done and the commissioners approved the purchase of the insurance at this meeting. Sierra expects to meet with the mayor and the city manager soon in connection with the application for disaster relief funding.

On the right, this plant was spotted at the CM Allen Homes recently. Although it is called the century plant, it typically lives only 10 to 30 years. Near the end of its life, the plant sends up a tall, branched stalk, with yellow blossoms. The plant dies after flowering, but produces shoots from the base, which continue its growth. Maria Pena, a former resident, told us she planted it in 2008 so this is what you would call an early bloomer, for sure!

Thursday, July 26 7:00 to 8:00 p.m.


