We all know what he meant to us, in terms of his role as the Maintenance Administrative Assistant, but I wanted to share a more personal perspective from one of our residents. Edward guided her to join the Family Self-Sufficiency program at Chapultepec. Her memories tell us so much more about what we have all lost.

REMEMBERING EDWARD

I remember 2013. It was the first time we ever met. I didn't leave the best first impression on you, but you didn't judge me. You still showed me so much respect. I was so young-minded at one point in my life ...no kids no responsibilities...not a care in the world. I didn't have a clue what I was doing with my life . . . until I became pregnant

with my first child, Amya Emeri. Because she was my first child, I was so anxious to have her and I felt so lost. One night I kept having non-stop contractions. And boy were those contractions painful! You didn't hesitate to drive me to the Kyle hospital three times that night, until they told me "Roxy it's time to have us a baby."

I remember you and my mom smiling non-stop because how excited y'all were to be grandparents for the first time. After having Amya, you came into my room. All happy and nervous but at the same time you were ready to hold her. I'll never forget the smile on your face when you held her in your arms for the first time. I knew right there and then that you would love her forever. You never got to have any kids of your own so I was thankful to share this first time parenting with you. You were both a grandfather and father in my kids' eyes. From the moment they were born, you were always so patient with them, even on the days I wasn't. You never let my girls feel left out when it came to Father occasions. Amya, Khloe, and Evie were so blessed to have you fill that part for them. They never felt like they didn't have a father. Especially Amya who was so happy that she had you to take her to the Father-Daughter Dance. You had a different, but beautiful bond with each of my daughters.

You played such a big role in my life and in the lives of my kids. From teaching my girls how to ride a bike for the first time, to pulling out the pool on a hot sunny day while cooking it up in your barbecue pit and playing your kind of music, to you walking them to school on their first day. You were there for everything for my girls. You made it on time to all their school performances, no matter what you had going on at work. You always put them first. I remember seeing you tear up the day Amya graduated from pre-K. You were so proud of her. You always reminded my girls how smart and beautiful they were. Every Halloween we would always make it fun for the girls. Like that time Grandma kept changing costumes in the house. During the pandemic, she even dressed like you. Ha-hal We couldn't stop laughing. And every Christmas, whatever I couldn't get, you were always there to get it so the girls had what they wanted on their check list.

I'll also never forget a time when I was at my lowest – feeling weak and empty after losing my dearest friend, Breana Martinez. You lifted me out of depression on multiple occasions. You showed me the strength that I never knew I had. You always pushed me to do better. Even when I felt like I couldn't move. If it wasn't for you pushing me so hard, I wouldn't have the things I have today, like the strength to let some things go and to enjoy life every day like it's my last and being positive within myself. Your words helped me have a better and grown-up mindset throughout the years.

I appreciate everything you have ever done for me and my girls. They still cry for you so much because of how much they love you. I always remind them that you are in a better place now . . . and rockin' out with the angels. Khloe sometimes grabs her guitar — the one you customized for her — and starts singing out of the blue while sitting in her room. She always asks, "Mommy, you think Grandpa can hear me singing from heaven?" I always tell her, "He's sitting here with us listening to you now."

I was beyond thankful and blessed to have someone like you in my life. Thank you for always being there for us no matter what. We will never forget you. And we love and miss you every day. ~Roxanne Louise Garcia

Prior to graduation, my brother received a meritorious promotion to Private First Class, which




his military experience through travel opportunities in the future. I am proud of my brother. He is a great role model and I am beyond excited to see what the future holds for him.
